### STUDENT RESOURCES

- **Student ID Cards**

All students are required to obtain an ID card. ID cards will be issued in the Student Services Department located on the first floor of the Adams Building, Monday-Thursday, 2:00-5:00 p.m.

- **Parking Decals**

All students are required to obtain a parking decal for the privilege of parking on any Troy University campus. A \$25 annual fee is assessed for the parking decals and may be purchased from the office of student services. Please place the decal on the rear windshield of your vehicle.

- **Web Express**

Web Express is a versatile online tool that students may use to register for classes, check financial aid status, make payments, change student information and monitor academic progress. Go to <http://phenix.troy.edu> and click on webexpress. Find your user ID by clicking "What's my User ID?". Your initial password will be the last four of your social security number. (password must be changed on first login.)

- **Troy Email**

Go to <http://phenix.troy.edu> and click on web mail. User name will be the same as your User ID. Your initial password will be your birth date. (mmddyyyy).

All official information, including but not limited to, student billing, faculty-student communications, registration changes and financial aid information will be sent to the student's TROY email address. The University accepts no responsibility for forwarding e-mail to non university e-mail accounts.

All students are responsible for monitoring their Trojan Email account frequently.

## Admissions Information

- **Blackboard**

Students must make application to the University and be admitted by the Admissions Office before registering for classes. In some mitigating circumstances, a student may be admitted as a temporary student for one semester provided they present admissible documentation. Students, without exception, will not be allowed to register for a second semester until all admission requirements have been met. ### GRADUATE ADMISSION TEST REQUIREMENTS

Graduates must submit test scores from the GRE or MAT exam as a part of the graduate application process. The MAT is regularly offered at the Phenix City Campus. Students may register until the day preceding the test date. Capacity for each test is limited and may be filled prior to this date.

Pre-registration is required by completing a REGISTRATION CARD and paying a \$70.00 test fee to the Cashier. Two forms of identification (one with picture), social security number and #2 pencils are required at the time of testing.

- **Prerequisites**

Students must meet all prerequisites for specific courses. See the appropriate Graduate or Undergraduate Catalog for more information.

- **Academic Advising**

All students are assigned an academic advisor who is a faculty member from the department that administers the student's declared major. New students are required to meet with their academic advisor prior to registering for the first time. If a student is unable to contact the advisor at any time, the department chair is the next most appropriate contact.

- **Academic Department and Faculty Hours**

Academic Departments will be open from Monday through Thursday from 8 a.m. – 6 p.m. The faculty is normally available 2 p.m.-6 p.m. Monday-Thursday, when classes are in session. Additional hours are available by appointment (contact the department secretary). Office hours for specific faculty members will vary. All full-time instructors will post office hours, and departmental secretaries are available to assist students in contacting faculty.

- **Course Load for Students with a Conditional or Temporary Admission Status**

Undergraduate students are limited to a maximum of 12 credit hours. Temporary status is limited to one semester of enrollment.

Graduate Students are limited to a maximum of 9 credit hours. Temporary status is limited to one semester of enrollment.

- **Course Overload**

Overloads require advisor permission and signature of the department chair.

- **Weekend Classes**

Students must register for weekend classes at least 2 weeks prior to the first weekend class meeting. Students are responsible for getting the syllabus from the website, [phenix.troy.edu](http://phenix.troy.edu) and complying with all class requirements.

**Please note: Textbooks for weekend classes are refundable with a receipt up until the first day of class only. Check your syllabus for textbook requirements and accuracy prior to class.**

- **TroyPC/CVCC Joint Classes**

- **eCampus Classes**

eCampus classes utilize Blackboard software. Information on using Blackboard software may be found on the Troy Phenix City website <http://phenix.troy.edu>. Click on "Student Resources" and then on "Student Handbook" for information.

Make sure that you order your book(s) early or have them shipped to you by the fastest means possible. You are responsible for making sure you receive your textbooks in a timely manner.**

## Steps to Online Registration

**NOTE: First semester TROY students who have not attended a new student orientation session will not be able to register online.**

1. Consult with your academic adviser and plan your schedule carefully.
2. Go to <http://www.phenix.troy.edu> and click on Web Express.
3. Click on the "Log In" button at the top right of the screen. If you do not know your User name click on students menu, then on "What's My User ID?"
4. Click on "Register for Sections" the student can choose express registration or search and register for classes.

## Express Registration

If you know the exact subject, course number, and section number of the classes for which you wish to register, select "Express Registration".

1. You can register for a course by entering the six-digit synonym number or by entering the course subject, course number and section (i.e., IS 2241 PAAU); the appropriate term for which you are registering (i.e. 07/FA). After entering all of the courses you plan to take, you may click on the "submit" button.
2. A new screen will show the results of your registration submission. You will need to click on drop down box below "Action" for each course. Choose "RGRegister" for each course and click "Submit". An error message will appear if you are ineligible to register for courses.
3. You may print your schedule by pressing the print icon on the toolbar.

## Search and Register for Classes

If you do NOT know the exact subject, course number, and section for the courses for which you plan to register, click on "Search and Register for Classes". You will be able to limit your search by campus or location, term, subject, course level, instructor, and/or meeting days and times.

1. Click on the appropriate term or search and end dates.
2. Fill out two additional fields to narrow search.
3. Click on "Submit"
4. Check the box to the left of the course that you are submitting for registration.

5. Click on "Submit"
6. A new screen will show the results of your registration submissions. You will need to click drop down box below "Action" for each course. Choose "RGRegister" for each course and click "Submit". An error message will appear if you are ineligible to register for courses.
7. You may print your schedule by pressing the print icon on the toolbar.

## Dropping and Withdrawing from Classes

### • Dropping a Class

Before the semester begins, a student desiring to drop a class must notify the Phenix City Campus in writing (either in person or via fax at 334-448-5229.) Students with an unconditional admission status may drop the class via the Trojan Web Express. After classes begin, a student desiring to drop a class must notify the Records Department in writing (either in person or via fax at 334-448-5229). **Classes may not be added or dropped at any time over the telephone!**

### • Withdrawal from the University

Students withdrawing from all classes before the semester begins must notify Troy Phenix City in writing. Students withdrawing after classes have begun must begin the process by obtaining a Withdrawal Form in the Records Office on the First Floor of the Adams Building.

### • Dropping eCampus Classes

## Refund Policies

- **Phenix City Campus Weeknight or Weekday Classes**

Students who drop a class by the last day of add/drop are entitled to a refund of all tuition and fees associated with that class. Students who drop a class after the first week of classes are liable for all tuition and fees associated with that class.

**Textbooks are refundable with a receipt and a signed copy of your withdrawal form within 30 days from the beginning of the semester.**

- **Phenix City Campus Weekend Classes**

Students dropping a weekend class before the class meets are entitled to a refund for all tuition and fees associated with that class. Students may drop a weekend class after the first weekend but before the second weekend without academic penalty but will be liable for all tuition and fees associated with that class.

- **eCampus Classes**

- **Financial Aid Students for all campuses or sites**

A student who is withdrawn by the University for disciplinary reasons, or for non-payment of tuition and fees is not eligible for a refund of any nature.

**Special Note: Students, who for any reason, register for classes but do not attend MUST NOTIFY THE REGISTRAR'S OFFICE IN WRITING TO WITHDRAW. Any student who fails to do so will be responsible for payment of fees.**

### In-State Tuition for Georgia Residents

- **Tuition and Payment Information Due Dates**

Tuition and fees are due on **August 13, 2007** for students registering during early or regular registration periods. Students are financially obligated to pay all tuition and fees for courses registered, regardless of pending financial aid.

- **Policy Statement for Payment Plan:**

Registration is not complete until a minimum of one third of tuition, fees, and all other expenses is paid plus any balance from a previous term. The 1st one-third payment and all previous balances must be paid by 6:00 p.m. on **August 13, 2007**. If you choose to use the payment plan a \$25.00 non-refundable fee will be added to your account. Awarded Financial Aid will automatically be calculated toward the one third payment requirement.

## Payment Plan Procedures:

1. Early Registration - Students who register will receive a statement showing charges incurred. Students are required to pay 1/3 of the total charges for the semester they are registering and any balance from the previous term on or before **August 13, 2007**.
2. Regular Registration and Late Registration - Students will be presented with a bill that indicates the dates payments are due: total amount or first 1/3, second 1/3, and third 1/3. A student must pay the first 1/3 payment amount plus any previous balance before they are considered registered.
3. All registered students (students who have satisfied the 1/3 payment) will receive an account statement via email showing the dates of the remaining payments at least 10 days prior to the due date for the remaining installments. Students should regularly check their accounts on line using the Trojan Web Express prior to each payment due date.
4. Students who do not pay their remaining installments should be aware that failure to pay will result in not being able to register the next semester, a business office restriction will be placed on their account preventing the release of transcripts and any subsequent registrations.

## Trojan OneCard

- **How are TROY refunds delivered to students?**

Each registered TROY student will receive a Trojan OneCard. Your card will arrive in the mail at your address on file with the University. To receive your refund, you must activate your Trojan OneCard. During card activation, you will choose how to receive your refund money. If you want faster access to your funds, simply choose to have your refunds deposited directly into your OneAccount. - **What are my options for receiving all student refunds, including financial aid refunds?**

Your options include having your refund:

1. Directly deposited to your OneAccount -Easy Refund (1 day or less).
2. Deposited to another bank of your choice (2 – 3 business days).
3. Mailed, as a paper check, to the address you designate (5 – 7 business days).

- **What is the OneAccount?**

The OneAccount from Higher One is a fully functioning FDIC insured FREE CHECKING account that allows you to access your student refunds quicker and easier than ever before. The OneAccount has no minimum balance, no monthly fees, and free internet banking features. With it, you can use your Trojan OneCard to make purchases anywhere Debit MasterCard® is accepted.

- **What are the advantages of having my refunds deposited directly to my OneAccount?**

1. Easy Refund (depositing your refund to your OneAccount) is the quickest way to gain access to your money. In order to have your refund directly deposited, activate your TROY OneAccount as soon as possible.
2. You can use the Trojan OneCard as a debit card (NOT A CREDIT CARD) to make purchases at all Debit MasterCard locations, access cash at an ATM, pay bills, send money electronically and so much more.
3. There is no charge to you for receiving your refund directly in your TROY OneAccount. There is no monthly fee or minimum balance for the OneAccount.

- **How will I know when my refund has been deposited to my OneAccount?**

You will receive an e-mail when your refund has been directly deposited to your OneAccount. Additionally, you will be able to see details of your OneAccount by accessing your OneAccount Statement on the website.

- **Can I have my refund deposited to another**

- **bank account?**

If you choose to have your refund deposited to a bank of your choice, this transfer may take 2-3 business days from the day the University releases the funds. In order to have your refund deposited to your bank, you must first activate your Trojan OneCard at [www.TrojanOneCard.com](http://www.TrojanOneCard.com). For this option, you will need to complete, print and mail the third party form to the designated address. This form is available on [www.TrojanOneCard.com](http://www.TrojanOneCard.com).

- **Can I select a paper check instead?**

You may choose to have a paper check sent to you via regular mail. However, a paper check may take up to 5-7 days from the day the University releases the funds. Regardless of how you choose to receive your funds, you still need to activate your card at [www.TrojanOneCard.com](http://www.TrojanOneCard.com).

- **Why is the Debit MasterCard® logo on the new Trojan OneCard?**

The Trojan OneCard is the card you use to access your funds if you choose to accept the OneAccount. With the Debit MasterCard logo on it, you can use the card as a debit card wherever Debit MasterCard® is accepted. The card is NOT a credit card. It is a DEBIT card.

- **What will happen to my refund if I don't activate my Trojan OneCard?**

TROY will not be able to disburse your refund to you. Regardless of whether you anticipate that you will receive a refund, it is important to activate your card and choose a refund preference at [www.TrojanOneCard.com](http://www.TrojanOneCard.com).

- **What do I do if I did not receive my Trojan OneCard in the mail?**

You may log on to [www.TrojanOneCard.com](http://www.TrojanOneCard.com) and use the "Where's my Card" self help feature that will provide you with the real time status of your card. Or, you may visit the Card Office located in your TROY Business Office.

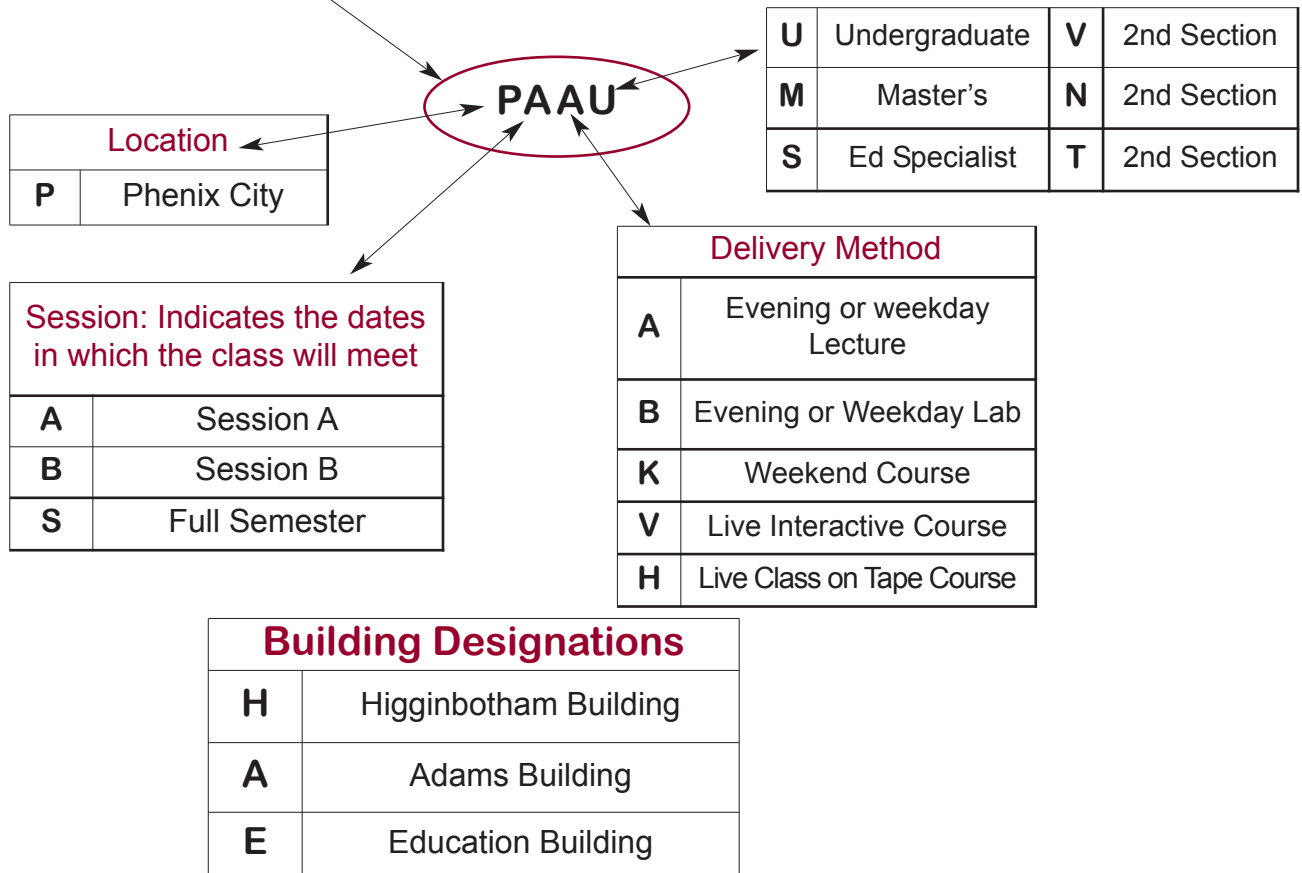
