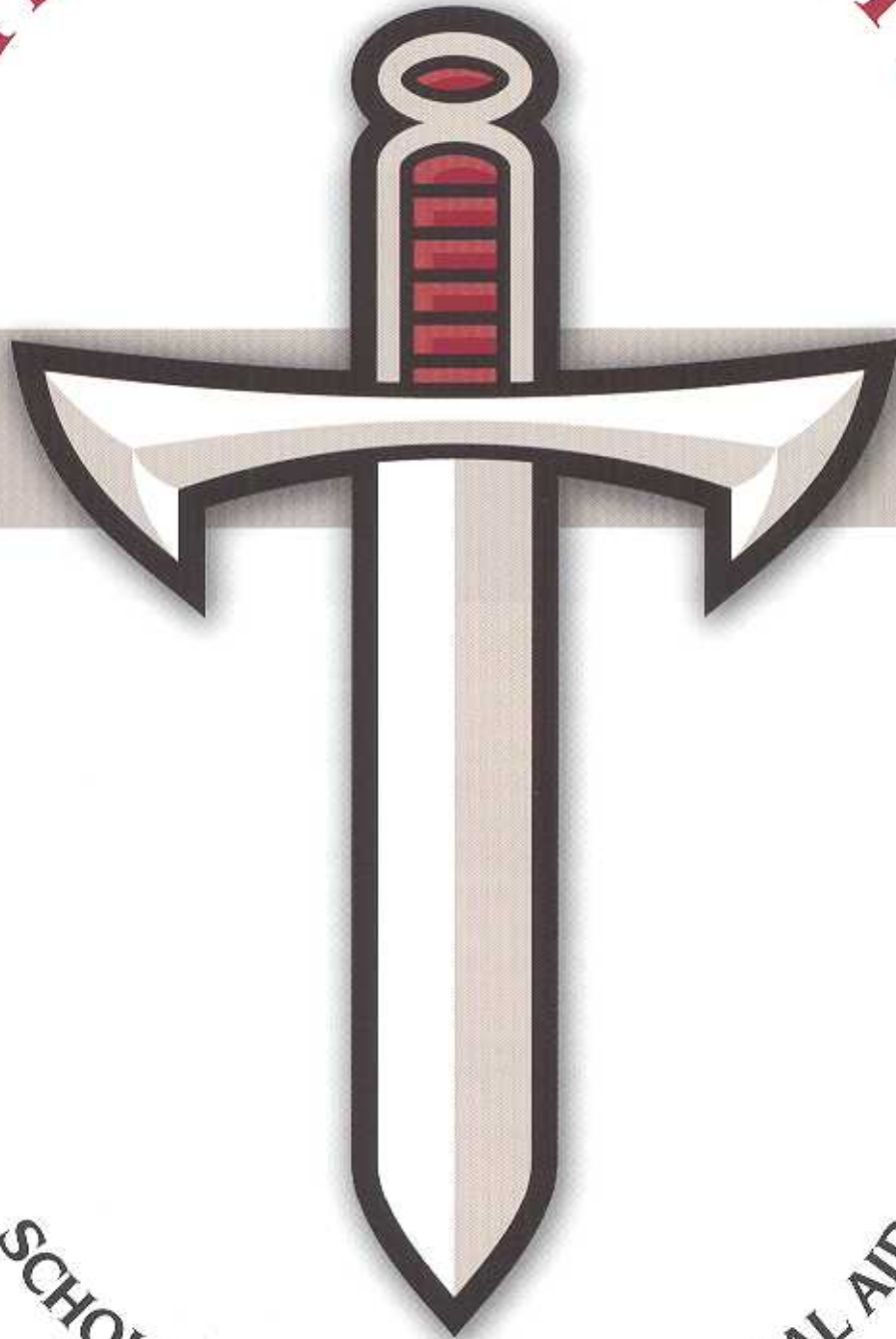

THE INVESTMENT

The following information should assist you in planning for the costs of full-time undergraduate attendance. At Troy University, full-time students take at least 12 hours and may take up to 16 hours of course work each semester for the full-time tuition rate. The amounts shown in the next column are for one academic semester, during the 2007-2008 school year. Basic phone, basic cable and internet access are included in the housing price. In addition to the costs listed in the table, personal expenses, which will vary from student to student, should be considered.

PAYMENT DEADLINES

The payment of your tuition, housing, meal plan and other fees is part of the registration process. Payment or payment agreement is required before each semester's registration is complete. Payment can be made in cash, check, money order or with your VISA, MasterCard or Discover credit card. Outside scholarships are also considered in meeting payment toward the semester charges. Scholarship awards can also be used to meet payment deadlines. Other valid forms of payment include sponsoring agency contract; tuition assistance from various private, federal and state funds; the Alabama P.A.C.T. program; faculty/staff or University departmental grants supported by written documentation. Other expenses you may incur, such as library fines, parking tickets etc. will be charged to your account if they go unpaid. These charges are payable when incurred and are billed to your permanent home address.

PAYMENT ALTERNATIVE

Troy University offers alternative payment option: the 1/3 payment plan. The 1/3 payment plan requires an equally divided payment to be made at 3 different times during the semester. For more information contact the office of Student Financial Services at 334-670-3124.

ACADEMIC AND LEADERSHIP *Scholarship Programs*

PURPOSE

Troy University scholarships are designated to recognize high school and junior or community college students who have excelled in academic and/or leadership capacities. These scholarships are awarded solely on merit. All students who have achieved scholastic or leadership recognition are urged to apply for the following as well as for applicable department scholarships. These scholarships are awarded to students on the **Troy, Alabama campus of Troy University**. TROY scholarships are four-year awards for high school students and two-year awards for junior or community college students. The University Scholarship Committee makes the selections determined by the qualifications of the applicants and the availability of funds.

THE ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS

TROY Academic Scholarships are based on scholarly excellence. Awards are generally made with the following guidelines:

- **THE MILLENNIUM SCHOLARS'S AWARD** (Maximum of 60 awarded)
Full tuition, room, and board
Requirements: 31 ACT/1380 SAT (CR and Mathematics Only) 3.7 GPA/4.0 scale or national Merit Finalist/Semifinalist
- **THE CHANCELLOR'S AWARD**
Full tuition
Requirements: 27 ACT/1220 SAT (CR and Mathematics Only) 3.5 GPA/4.0 scale

THE LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIPS

Leadership Scholarships are based upon achievement in leadership positions in high school or junior or community college. Selection is generally based on an overall evaluation of the student's accomplishments by the Committee, however, these guidelines are used:

- **EXCELLENCE IN LEADERSHIP AWARD**
The amount of this award varies
Requirements: 22 ACT/1030 SAT (CR and Mathematics Only) and 3.0 GPA/4.0 scale
Counselor recommendation; interview with TROY faculty or staff member; resume of leadership activities. Upon enrollment, the recipient will be required to attend a leadership seminar each semester and must agree to serve three hours per week in a leadership intern position.
Application deadline is January 15 of senior year.
- **PHI THETA KAPPA AWARD**
Each Alabama junior/community college chapter of Phi Theta Kappa may annually nominate one student.
\$1,100 per year
Requirements: Two years of complete academic work; 3.5 GPA/4.0 scale; nomination letter from Phi Theta Kappa Advisor.

POLICIES: These published guidelines are intended merely to assist a student in a decision to apply. Applications should not be considered binding. The University encourages interested students who believe they qualify to apply for the scholarships. Academic Scholarships and Leadership Scholarships cannot be combined. Students eligible for both awards may elect to choose the scholarship of higher monetary value. All applicants will be given full consideration.

- Beginning freshman must apply during their senior year of high school or prior to August following the school graduation. Transfer students must apply during their tenure at the individual institutions from which they are transferring and must complete two years at the junior/community college. Awards will be based on post-secondary activities.
- Qualified students must accept and utilize the scholarship program prior to attendance at TROY or any four-year college.
- TROY Scholarships are not renewable unless a student has been enrolled for two semesters of the preceding academic year (unless a student has been forced to withdraw because of illness or matters beyond his or her control.)
- Qualification for the maintenance of all the Millennium Scholar's Award is an overall 3.3 GPA. For the Chancellor's Award, the student must maintain an overall 3.0 GPA. For the Excellence in Leadership and Phi Theta Kappa, the student must maintain an overall 2.7 GPA.
- In all cases where the term tuition is used above, it refers to out-of-state as well as in-state tuition.
- Junior or community college transfer students who meet the designated ACT/SAT and GPA criteria may be eligible for the Millennium Scholar's Award or the Chancellor's Award. The required GPA must have been maintained throughout the post-secondary work.

ALUMNI & AUXILIARY Scholarship Programs

PURPOSE

Troy University Alumni & Auxiliary Scholarships are designed to recognize students who will bring a unique characteristic to our student body. Our Alumni scholarships seek to enhance the University's relationship with the Trojan Nation. The Auxiliary scholarships seek to add to the University's diverse student population & reward well-rounded students.

THE ALUMNI SCHOLARSHIPS

- **THE ALUMNI ASSOCIATION ENDOWMENT SCHOLARSHIP**

Half-Tuition

Requirements: Unconditionally Admitted to TROY; Leadership Achievements; Preference is given to student whose family members hold a degree from TROY and are active members of the National Alumni Association. Application deadline is April 1 of senior year.

- **THE HERITAGE SCHOLARSHIP**

\$500 Non-Renewable

Requirements: Unconditionally Admitted to TROY with at least a 3.0 GPA/4.0 scale; Applicant must be dependant child of Alumni; Must not be receiving additional institutional scholarships or employee tuition assistance. Application deadline is March 1 of senior year.

THE AUXILIARY SCHOLARSHIPS

- **THE TROJAN OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP**

The amount of this award varies.

Requirements: Unconditionally Admitted to TROY with at least a 3.0 GPA/4.0 scale; Must submit resume of leadership activities; Applicants must be from out-of-state with preference given to applicants from Florida & Georgia. Application deadline March 1 of senior year.

- **THE ALABAMA GIRLS STATE SCHOLARSHIP**

\$1,000 Non-Renewable

Requirements: Unconditionally Admitted to TROY with at least a 3.0 GPA/4.0 scale; Must be or have been a participant & attendee of Alabama Girls State Program. Application deadline March 1 of senior year.

POLICIES: These published guidelines are intended merely to assist a student in a decision to apply. Applications should not be considered binding. The University encourages interested students who believe they qualify to apply for the scholarships. Alumni & Auxiliary scholarships cannot be combined with Millennium or Chancellor's Awards. Students eligible for both awards may elect to choose the scholarship of higher monetary value. All applicants will be given full consideration.

Beginning freshman must apply during their senior year of high school. Transfer students must apply during their tenure at the individual institutions from which they are transferring and must complete two years at the junior/community college. Awards will be based on post-secondary activities.

Qualified students must accept and utilize the scholarship program prior to attendance at TROY or any four-year college. TROY scholarships are not renewable unless a student has been enrolled for two semesters of the preceding academic year (unless a student has been forced to withdraw because of illness or matters beyond his or her control). Recipients must maintain full-time status (12+ hours) each academic term.

In all cases where the term tuition is used above, it refers to out-of-state as well as in-state tuition. Alumni, Heritage, & Trojan Opportunity scholarships are renewable for four years. Qualification for maintenance of these awards is a 2.7 GPA.

Complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid online at www.fafsa.ed.gov

1. Open your browser and go to www.fafsa.ed.gov
2. Select "Fill Out a FAFSA," then follow the on-screen instructions to fill out the application.
3. If you need help while you're filling out your FAFSA, click on the "chat" link on any application screen to chat online with a customer service representative. you don't have to exit the application or go to a phone to receive fast, courteous, real-time help.
4. Review your answers and, if necessary, correct them before transmitting your application.
5. Sign your FAFSA. If you are a dependent, your parent also needs to sign. You have three options for signing your online FAFSA.
 - If you have a PIN, you can electronically sign your FAFSA.
 - You can print a paper signature page from FAFSA on the Web, sign it, and mail it to the address provided.
 - Or, you can transmit your online FAFSA without signing. If you choose this option, A Student Aid Report (SAR) will be sent to you in the mail requesting signatures. Sign and return your SAR right away so that we can continue to process your FAFSA.
6. Once you have decided how to sign your application you will need to transmit it by clicking on the "Submit My FAFSA Now" button at the bottom of the screen. You will be taken to a web page that confirms you have successfully transmitted your FAFSA. Note your confirmation number and your estimated Expected Family Contribution (EFC). Your school will use your EFC to determine the types and amounts of aid you will receive.
7. You should receive a SAR Information Acknowledgement in the mail about two weeks after submitting your online FAFSA. If you provided an e-mail address on your FAFSA, your SAR will be e-mailed to you.
8. If you do not already have a PIN at the time you submit your FAFSA, one will automatically be mailed to you around the same time you receive your SAR. If you provided an e-mail address on your FAFSA, your PIN will be e-mailed to you.
