Campus life

Troy University provides students with numerous recreational outlets and facilities including a health club, tennis courts, golf course, weight room, indoor and outdoor pools, and a large game room located in the Student Center. A well-rounded program of student activities includes weekly movies, concerts, plays and athletics. Student clubs and social organizations complement the academic program. Services include academic advising, comprehensive counseling, health services, and career planning and placement. Students are encouraged to take advantage of learning opportunities and resources available in the computer laboratories and at the 40 hectare arboretum, as well as in classrooms and the library.

Housing

The newly renovated TROY Rotary International Living Center provides a "home away from home" for both American and international students. The center accommodates 132 students and promotes cultural understanding and appreciation between nations. It is open 365 days per year for use by all international students.

The International Center includes suites with semi-private kitchens and bathrooms, study lounges and recreation rooms equipped with billiards, table tennis and television/VCR to give students places to relax. Each room has telephone and T-1 Internet connections.



Available to students

Dining facilities—Frank's Place, Stewart Dining Hall and Student Center Food Court—provide a variety of meals to meet the needs of students, including those with food restrictions. Meal plans are available.

Free Weekly Movies—large on-campus theater

Internet Connection—Internet connections and e-mail accounts available at no cost to allow for easy overseas communication

Computer Center—available daily for student use offering access to and instruction in micro-computing, including word-processing, spreadsheets and multimedia

Specialized Computer Labs are available in business, education, journalism, psychology, English, science and mathematics. The library has many electronic services such as computerized indexes, and international networking service providing access to more than 2,900 networks and more than 200 library catalogues and databases.

Recreation Facilities—Tennis courts; indoor and outdoor swimming pools; weight room; fitness center; game room with billiards, table tennis and other games; sports fields; and golf course; recreation center with basketball and handball court.

Calendar

Troy University operates on an early semester system. That means we have two semesters plus a shorter summer session. Normally the fall semester begins in late August and concludes in early December. Spring semester begins in early January and ends in early May. The summer session is held during June and July. For specific dates, see the attached materials. Students entering the English as a Second Language [ESL] program have additional options (see below).

Scholarship Opportunities

International Student Scholarships are available on a limited basis for exceptional students.

Undergraduate Scholarship Opportunities

- Prepared Student Scholarships - \$1,000 for students scoring above 550 (213cbt) on the TOEFL.
- International Exchange Scholarships - \$1,000 for students who will present programs on their home countries to campus and community organizations
- International Honor Scholarships - \$2,000 for students who maintain a B average [3.0 or higher and have completed 30 semester hours at Troy University]

Undergraduate Admission

First-Time University Students

The following credentials must be filed with the Center for International Programs:

1. Admissions Application form
2. Official secondary school transcript, including notice of graduation
3. Evidence of English language proficiency. Minimum acceptable levels are: TOEFL - 500 (paper), 174 (Computer), IELTS 5.5, SAT 870 with a minimum of 430 on the verbal portion
4. A detailed statement of financial status that clearly documents the student's ability to finance studies at Troy University. (These documents must show a minimum of \$15,500 available per academic year.)
5. Application fee of \$30

Transfer Students

Transfer students must also submit official transcripts from the universities they have attended.

Graduate Admission

The following credentials must be filed with the Center for International Programs:

For Unconditional Admission:

1. Admissions Application form
2. The official transcripts from your undergraduate university, indicating completion of the equivalent of a baccalaureate degree in the U.S.
3. Evidence of English language proficiency—minimum acceptable levels are: TOEFL - 525 (paper), 197 (Computer), IELTS 6. [Not required for students who have graduated from U.S. universities.]
4. An acceptable score on the appropriate entrance exam (GRE 850 - verbal and quantitative, GMAT 450) - temporary admission may be granted without this score.
5. Detailed statement of financial status that clearly documents the student's ability to finance studies at Troy University. These documents must show a minimum of \$14,500 available per academic year.
6. Application fee of \$50
7. Acceptable Recommendation

For Temporary Admission:

Temporary admission can be granted after the receipt of all the above except for the GMAT or GRE test score.

For Conditional Admission:

Students who submit GMAT or GRE scores below the minimum may be granted conditional admission if they have satisfactory undergraduate records.

Students who do not submit TOEFL scores or who submit TOEFL scores below the required minimum can be admitted to either graduate or undergraduate programs, but they will first be required to take intensive English language courses at Troy University until they achieve the required minimum TOEFL score and adequate English language proficiency. Because graduate studies require active student participation in classes, all graduate students must take a diagnostic test of their speaking and listening ability upon arrival. Based on the results of that test, intensive English courses may be required.

Troy University operates on an early semester system with two semesters plus a shorter summer session. Normally the fall semester begins in late August and concludes in early December. Spring semester begins in early January and ends in early May. The summer session is held during June and July. For specific dates, see the attached materials.

Where is Troy?

The city of Troy, which has a population of approximately 15,000, is located in the southeastern part of the United States in the state of Alabama. Alabama is located adjacent to the states of Florida and Georgia. Troy was founded in 1843 and is a university town. Its location guarantees students one of the cleanest environments and highest levels of safety in the U.S. The residents of Troy take great interest in the University and extend a cordial welcome to students, faculty and staff. Numerous social, church, civic and school organizations provide cultural enrichment. The Troy University campus is a large, wooded area of 234 hectare chiefly in the southeastern quarter of Troy, one kilometer from the heart of the city.
