Associate of Science in Nursing Program
Progression Policy Change Proposal

At the April 17, 2006 ASN Faculty Meeting, ASN faculty voted to change the ASN Progression Policy as follows:

- 1.) Nutrition (either NSG 2213 or NSG 2204) will now be included as a nursing course that a student is allowed to repeat only ONE time to achieve a grade of C or better.
- 2.) NSG 2213 (Nutrition) or NSG 2204 (Nutrition) credit hours will now be included as part of the maximum number of credit hours an ASN student can fail (i.e., failure of the two hours of NSG 2213 or NSG 2204 at Troy University will be included in the policy that states "a grade of D or F in more than nine semester hours of nursing courses will result in automatic dismissal from the ASN Program."

The rationale for these proposed changes is that the Nutrition course (either NSG 2213 or NSG 2204) is considered as important as all the other nursing courses, and therefore it should not be "singled out" and excluded in either of the above components of the ASN Progression Policy.

Please refer to the Troy University Undergraduate Catalog under ASN "Progression."

The Catalog states: "c. A student will be able to repeat a nursing course only one time to achieve a grade of C or better (only exception is NSG 2213)."

PROPOSED CHANGE: Remove the statement, "(only exception is NSG 2213)."

The Catalog also states: "d. A grade of D or F in more than nine semester hours of nursing courses will result in automatic dismissal from the ASN Program."

PROPOSED CHANGE: Add the statement: "This nine hours also includes Nutrition (either NSG 2213 or NSG 2204)." This statement will be for clarification since the nutrition course credit hours have not previously been included in the "nine hours."
